Mozart's Piano Concerto #20 in D minor is considered to be one of the greatest concertos in the repertoire, a masterpiece of form and structure, and a work of such drama and beauty that it has retained popularity for over two hundred years. Finished on 10th February 1785, and premiered the following evening, this darkest of concertos was an extraordinary departure for Mozart, anticipating the Romantic drama of Beethoven.

<i>Mozart: Piano Concerto No. 21 Music Appreciation</i>
The construction of this sonata is unusual because it contains no movement whatever in sonata form, and because of the form in which the opening movement is written, viz., that of an air with variations. Air and Variation IV: The fourth variation is rendered very distinctive by the continual crossing of the left hand over the right.

Mozart's Piano Concerto No.20 While Beethoven only wrote five piano concertos, Mozart powered through an extremely respectable 23. Of course Mozart's were generally smaller and, it would be fair to say, slighter works – in fact Mozart said of three of his piano concertos "In order to win applause one must write stuff which is so inane that a coachman could sing it".

The first subject is only seven bars in length. It is an eight bar sentence contracted to seven by overlapping of the two phrases in Bar 4. Bars 7-16: Bridge-passage or Transition (overlapping). The transition overlaps the first subject.

Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 21 was completed on 9th March 1785, just four weeks after Piano Concerto No. 20 in D Minor. A hugely impressive feat by anyone's time management track record. For Mozart however, it would have been by-the-by to complete two major works within a month of each other: there's a very good reason Mozart is lauded as one of the most brilliant composers who ever lived.

<i>Mozart's Piano Concerto No.21: Analysing K. 467</i>
The concerto is scored for solo piano, flute, two oboes, two bassoons, two horns in C, two trumpets in C, timpani and strings. The concerto has three movements : Allegro maestoso; in common time. The tempo marking is in Mozart's catalog of his own works, but not in the autograph manuscript.

Early Mozart concertos. Concertos Nos 1–4 (K.37, 39, 40 and 41) are orchestral and keyboard arrangements of sonata movements by other composers.The next three concertos (K. 107/1, 2 and 3), which are not numbered, are arrangements of piano sonatas by J.C. Bach (Op 5.Nos. 2, 3, and 4, all composed by 1766). Based on handwriting analysis of the autographs they are believed to date from 1771–72.
