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Qualitative Research Methods in Program Evaluation ...

Evaluation research, also known as program evaluation, refers to research purpose instead of a specific method. Evaluation research is the systematic assessment of the worth or merit of time, money, effort and resources spent in order to achieve a goal.

Program Evaluation - SAGE Research Methods

Program evaluation is NOT the same as research although they share many characteristics--Both: Start with questions Use similar methods Provide similar information Program evaluation focuses on decisions. Research focuses on answering questions about phenomena to discover new knowledge and test theories/hypotheses. Research is aimed at truth. Evaluation is aimed at action.

Program Evaluation: Background and Methods

Evaluation is a set of research methods and associated methodologies with a distinctive purpose. They provide a means to judge actions and activities in terms of values, criteria and standards. At the same time evaluation is also a practice that seeks to enhance effectiveness in the public sphere and policy making.

What is evaluation Back to determining the evaluation question. One way to do this is for the evaluator and program people to develop a very good description of: what the outcomes should be, how the program will get there, and why the program leads to the outcome. This description helps to identify how the program should lead to the

answer to this question: What is program evaluation?

Program evaluation represents an adaptation of social research methods to the task of studying social interventions so that sound judgments can be drawn about the social problems addressed, and the design, implementation, impact, and efficiency of programs that address those problems.

An Overview of Program Evaluation

Program evaluation is carefully collecting information about a program or some aspect of a program in order to make necessary decisions about the program. Program evaluation can include any or a variety of at least 35 different types of evaluation, such as for needs assessments, accreditation, cost/benefit analysis, effectiveness, efficiency, formative, summative, goal-based, process, outcomes, etc.

Program evaluation refers to the systematic, scientific, and rigorous investigation of a program’s effectiveness. In education research, for example, such evaluations examine the goal attainment and outcomes of programs designed to promote student, teacher, and/or school performance.

Program Evaluation - SAGE Research Methods

Evaluation is a research enterprise whose primary goal is to identify whether desired changes have been achieved. Evaluation is a type of applied social research that is conducted with a value, or set of values, in its “denominator.”. Evaluation research is always conducted with an eye to whether the desired outcomes, or results, of a program, initiative, or policy were achieved, especially as these outcomes are compared to a standard or criterion.

What’s the Difference? Evaluation vs. Research

Program Evaluation Focuses on a Program vs. a Population Research aims to produce new knowledge within a field. Ideally, researchers design studies to be able to generalize findings to the whole population—every single individual within the group being studied. Evaluation only focuses on the particular program at hand.
